More importantly, it helped the local league's Safety Officer to create awareness, through education and information, of the opportunities to provide a safer environment for kids and all participants of Little League Baseball.

Sonoma Little League has developed this safety plan to provide important information to managers, coaches, players and parents. The goal of this safety plan is to establish guidelines that will be used by all participants in Sonoma Little League, to ensure safety for all players, coaches and volunteers.

This safety plan is distributed to all managers at the start of each season. This manual is also readily available in all snack bars and equipment sheds and can also be viewed online at <u>www.sonomalittleleague.com</u>.

SAFETY CODE

The Sonoma Little League Safety Code has been adopted by the Board of Directors and is enforced by the Safety Officer and League President. All league participants, volunteers and officers are required to abide by this code. It is the responsibility of the Safety Officer to make revisions to the Safety Code from year to year, as necessary.

- Managers, coaches and umpires should have basic training in firstaid and CPR/AED. First-aid kits are distributed to each team at the beginning of the season and basic first- aid supplies are located at each field. An AED is located at the field.
- Managers and coaches are responsible for inspecting the fields (before games and practices) for holes, damage, stones, glass and other foreign objects prior.
- In games where Umpires are presiding, the Umpire will ensure that the managers and coaches carry out field inspections. Umpires have the discretion to call the game if it is determined that the field is not suitable for play.
- No games or practices shall be held when weather or field conditions are not safe, particularly when lighting is inadequate.
- All team equipment should be stored within the team dugout or behind screens and not within the area defined by the Umpires as "in play."
- Only players, managers, coaches and Umpires are permitted on the playing field or in the dugout during games and practices.
- Responsibility for keeping bats and loose equipment off the field of play should be that of a player assigned for this purpose or the team's manager and/or coaches.
- During practice and games, all players should be alert and watch the batter on each pitch.
- During warm-up drills players should be spaced so that no one is endangered by wild throws or missed catches.
- Equipment should be inspected regularly for the condition of the equipment as well as for proper fit. Replacements for damaged equipment can be obtained through the league's Equipment Manager.
- Batters must wear Little League Baseball approved protective helmets during batting practice and games.
- Catchers must wear a catcher's helmet, mask, throat guard, long model chest protector, shin guards and protective cup with

athletic supporter at all times for all practices and games. NO EXCEPTIONS! Manager should encourage all male players to wear protective cups and supporters for practices and games.

- Except when a runner is returning to a base, headfirst slides are not permitted.
- During sliding practice, bases should not be strapped down or anchored.
- At no time should "horseplay" be permitted on the playing field.
- Players must not wear watches, rings, pins or metallic items during games and practices.
- Parents of players who wear glasses should be encouraged to provide safety glasses.
- The catcher must wear a catcher's helmet and mask with the throat guard in warming up pitchers. This applies between innings in the bullpen during a game and during practices.
- An updated rule allows managers and coaches to warm-up pitchers or play catch with players as needed.
- On-deck batters are not permitted.
- All pregame warm-ups should be performed within the confines of the playing field and not within areas that are frequented by, and thus endanger spectators.

Sonoma Little League will require all teams to follow all Little League rules.

MANAGER'S REQUIRED EQUIPMENT

A manager and/or coach must bring the following to every practice or game:

- 1. Cell Phone
- 2. Proper league-issued playing equipment
- 3. First-Aid Kit
- Medical Release Forms for every player (paper or readily accessible digital format acceptable)
- 5. Safety Plan (paper or readily accessible digital format)

Voluteer Application

Sonoma Little League uses the JDP background check process each year.

Additionally, California law requires volunteers to be fingerprinted and complete a Livescan form. (Details may be found on the League website.

In the event a negative background check is received the applicant will be notified in writing. A copy of the negative background check will be maintained by the league for no less than 5 years.

ACCIDENT REPORTING PROCEDURE

1. WHAT to report.

An incident that causes any player, manager, coach, umpire or volunteer to receive medical treatment and/or first aid must be reported to the Safety Officer, Player Agent or League President. This includes even passive treatments such as the evaluation and diagnosis of the extent of the injury or periods of rest. If a player, manager, coach, umpire or volunteer is removed from a practice or game for an injury it is required to file a report. 2. WHEN to report.

All such incidents described above must be reported to the Safety Officer, Player Agent or League President within 24 hours of the incident.

3. HOW to make the report.

Incident reports may be filed on paper (available at the snack shack during games), with a follow up message/phone call to the safety officer. If an incident occurs at practice a phone/message/email report maybe be submitted. At a minimum, the following information must be provided:

- Name and phone number of the individual involved.
- Date, time and location of the incident.
- Detailed description of the incident.
- Preliminary estimation of the extent of any injuries.
- Name and phone number of the person reporting the injury.
- 4. Incident logs will be maintained digitally or hard copies for no less than 5 years.

Accident & Health (U.S.)

- This form must be completed by parents (if claimant is under 19 years of age) and a league offical and forwar ded to Little League Headquarters within 20 days after the accident. A photocopy of this form should be made and kept by the claimant/parent. Initial medical/ dental treatment must be rendered within 30 days of the Little League accident.
- Itemized bills including description of service, date of service, procedure and diagnosis codes formedical services/supplies and/or other documentation related to claim for benefit are to be provided within 90 days after the accident date. In no event shall such proof be furnished later than 12 months from the date the medical expense was incurred.
- 3. When other insurance is present, parents or slaimant must forward copies of the Explanation of Benefit or Notice/Letter of Denial for
- each charge directly to Little League Headquarters, even if the charges do not exceed the deductible of the primary insurance program. 4. Policy provides benefit for eligible reidi cal expenses incurred within 52 weeks of the accident, subject to Excess Coverage and
- Exclusion provisions of the plans
 Limited deferred medical/dental benefit ray be arai lable for necessary treatment incurred after 52 weeks. Refer to insurance brochure provided to the league president, or contact Little League Headquarters within the year of injury.

6. Accident Claim Form must be fully completed - including Social Security Number (SSN) - for processing.

For Residents of California:

Any person who knowingly presents a false or fraudulent claim for the payment of a loss is guilty of a crime and may be subject to fines and confinement in state prison.

For Residents of New York:

Any person who knowingly and with the intent to defraud any insurance company or other person files an application for insurance or statement of claim containing any materially false information, or conceals for the purpose of misleading, information concerning any fact material thereto, commits a fraudulent insurance act, which is a crime, and shall also be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed five thousand dollars and the stated value of the claim for each such violation.



SNACK BAR SAFETY CHECKLIST

- 1. Ensure all workers wash their hands before handling food.
- 2. Instruct workers that the "money handlers" should not handle unwrapped food items.
- 3. All workers should know where the fire extinguisher is and know how to use it.
- 4. All workers should know where the first aid kit and extra ice packs are located.
- 5. All tripping hazards should be cleared.
- 6. Items stored on shelves should be secured.
- Regularly inspect for frayed or damaged cords. Multi-prong adapters should not be used. Power strips are acceptable.
- 8. Food items should be kept at their proper temperature. No cooked items or opened food items shall be restored. These items should be thrown away at the end of daily operations.

Volunteers Must Wash Hands



WHEN

Wash your hands before you prepare food or as often as needed.

Wash after you:

- use the toilet
- touch uncooked meat, poultry, fish or eggs or other potentially hazardous foods
- interrupt working with food (such as answering the phone, opening a door or drawer)
- eat, smoke or chew gum
- touch soiled plates, utensils or equipment
- take out trash
- touch your nose, mouth, or any part of your body
- sneeze or cough

Do not touch ready-to-eat foods with your bare hands.

Use gloves, tongs, deli tissue or other serving utensils. Remove all jewelry, nail polish or false nails unless you wear gloves.

- wash your hands before you put on new gloves

Parent Code of Conduct

We, the _____Little League, have implemented the following Sport Parent Code of Conduct for the important message it holds about the proper role of parents in supporting their child in sports. Parents should read, understand and sign this form prior to their children participating in our league.

Any parent guilty of improper conduct at any game or practice will be asked to leave the sports facility and be suspended from the following game. Repeat violations may cause a multiple game suspension, or the season forfeiture of the privilege of attending all games.

Preamble

The essential elements of character-building and ethics in sports are embodied in the concept of sportsmanship and six core principles:

- Trustworthiness,
- Respect,
- Responsibility,
- Fairness,
- Caring, and
- Good Citizenship.

The highest potential of sports is achieved when competition reflects these "six pillars of character."

I therefore agree:

I will not force my child to participate in sports.

I will remember that children participate to have fun and that the game is for youth, not adults.

I will inform the coach of any physical disability or ailment that may affect the safety of my child or the safety of others.

I will learn the rules of the game and the policies of the league.

I (and my guests) will be a positive role model for my child and encourage sportsmanship by showing respect and courtesy, and by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches, officials and spectators at every game, practice or other sporting event.

I (and my guests) will not engage in any kind of unsportsmanlike conduct with any official, coach, player, or parent such as booing and taunting; refusing to shake hands; or using profane language or gestures.

I will not encourage any behaviors or practices that would endanger the health and well-being of the athletes.

I will teach my child to play by the rules and to resolve conflicts without resorting to hostility or violence.

I will demand that my child treat other players, coaches, officials and spectators with respect regardless of race, creed, color, sex or ability.

I will teach my child that doing one's best is more important than winning, so that my child will never feel defeated by the outcome of a game or his/her performance.

I will praise my child for competing fairly and trying hard, and make my child feel like a winner every time.

I will never ridicule or yell at my child or other participants for making a mistake or losing a competition.

I will emphasize skill development and practices and how they benefit my child over winning. I will also de-emphasize games and competition in the lower age groups.

I will promote the emotional and physical well- being of the athletes ahead of any personal desire I may have for my child to win.

I will respect the officials and their authority during games and will never question, discuss, or confront coaches at the game field, and will take time to speak with coaches at an agreed upon time and place.

I will demand a sports environment for my child that is free from drugs, tobacco, and alcohol and I will refrain from their use at all sports events.

I will refrain from coaching my child or other players during games and practices, unless I am one of the official coaches of the team.

Sonoma Little League Managers and Coaches Code of Conduct Agreement

2024 Sonoma Little League Safety Plan

We, the Sonoma Little League, have implemented the following Sport Coach Code of Conduct for the important message it holds about the proper role of managers and coaches in supporting players. Managers and Coaches must read, understand, and sign this form prior to participating in our league.

Any coach guilty of improper conduct at any game or practice will be held to the following:

- 1st Offense: (1) game suspension
- 2nd Offense: (2) game suspension and ineligible to manage or coach in any postseason play, including playoffs, TOC and All Stars.
- 3rd Offense: Expulsion from league

If a Coach/Manager is ejected from a game by an Umpire, and the ejection is deemed valid by the SLL board, that coach/manager will automatically serve a (1) games suspension.

Any coach who is ejected must leave the park and may not remain in the vicinity to observe the remainder of the game. If the coach incites more verbal aggression, or escalates the situation, does not leave the field or refuses to leave the vicinity, the game will be called and the offending coach's team will forfeit the game.

Suspended coaches must attend a meeting before the SLL board and Umpire in Chief within 72 hours to determine whether the offense warrants additional disciplinary action. Failure to appear at the time designated by the board will result in an indefinite suspension from all SLL activities until appearance.

I therefore agree:

- To never place the value of winning above the value of instilling the highest ideals of character.
- To strive to instill the value of good sportsmanship in all of his or her players.
- To use appropriate tones and language at all times.
- To demonstrate positive coaching methods, how to balance discipline and fun and correct athletes without being demeaning.
- To learn the rules of Little League and the policies of Sonoma Little League and for the appropriate age that I am coaching and adhere to all rules during practices and games.
- To give players a chance to play each game in accordance with minimum play rules of SLL.
- To avoid use of alcohol and or tobacco while interacting with players during practices or at games.
- To not engage in any kind of unsportsmanlike conduct with any official, coach, player, or parent such as booing and taunting; refusing to shake hands; or using profane language or gestures.
- To not indulge in conduct which would incite players or spectators against the umpires. Public criticism of officials or players is unethical.
- To meet and exchange cordial greetings with the opposing coach to set the correct tone for the event before and after the game.
- To defer all questions and communication to the adult game monitor or Umpire in Chief when all umpires are under the age of 18.

- To refrain from blurting out any call including but not limited to safe/out/runners interference as it interferes with the umpires ability to make a call in real time. (umpires to monitor and give warnings)
- To only have the manager of the team approach the plate umpire or adult game monitor.
- To only leave the dugout if given permission from the plate umpire or to take a place as a base coach or warm up a pitcher.
- To promote the emotional and physical well- being of the athletes and include all players without regard to race, religion, color, sex, sexual orientation, disability or any other state or federal protected class.
- To respect the officials and their authority during games and will never question, discuss, or confront coaches at the game field, and will take time to speak with coaches at an agreed upon time and place.
- To make sure practices and games are scheduled on a regular basis and that they will only be canceled with valid cause and communicated immediately.
- To meet with my team no more than 4 times per week, including games.
- To understand and practice basic first aid at all practices and games and will report any issues immediately.
- To discourage illegal or dangerous play.
 - To attend monthly Sonoma Little League Board Meetings as required for my division of play.
 - To complete all required training and background checks before meeting with players.
 - To honestly complete a volunteer application and any other documentation for Little League.
